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美国牛肉市场周报

美国牛肉市场动向

9月第一周，精选级牛胴体综合价较上上周的18.69美元/百磅创收至本周的15.81美元/百磅，低于去年同期的25.56美元/百磅和2023年同期的26.56美元/百磅。

与上周相比，精选级胸腹肉（short plate）、肋排（rib）、腰脊（loin）及前胸（brisket）等初级分割品价格均上涨，涨幅分别为：+2%、+1%、+1%和+1%。精选级后腿（round）和腹肋（flank）价格持平，而精选级肩胛（chuck）价格下跌1%。

临近年底节假日，精选级去骨重磅眼肉和西冷价格本周再度上涨。精选级去骨重磅眼肉价格于9月初触及14.72美元/磅，创下去年12月创纪录的15.14美元/磅以来的最高水平，随后在9月至10月期间温和回调，上周均价为13.78美元/磅。该产品价格通常在11月上旬上涨趋势，并于12月初达到年度峰值。本周价格环比上涨2%至14.01美元/磅，较去年同期上涨18%，较2023年同期上涨24%。

精选级西冷价格通常在每年6、7月达到峰值，随后季节性回落至10月。但今年价格仅在7月下旬有所回调，此后基本持稳甚至小幅走高。本周价格环比上涨3%至8.84美元/磅，为7月以来最高。西冷价格通常在10月积极性上涨。本周价格较去年同期上涨19%，较2023年同期上涨35%。

精选级去骨上后腰脊价格同样在每年6、7月达到峰值，随后季节性回落至10月。过去两周价格相对持稳，本周均价微跌0.2%至5.01美元/磅，较去年同期上涨17%，较2023年同期上涨31%。

精选级里脊价格在8月飙升，并于今年9月创下19.73美元/磅的历史新高，此后仅小幅回调。本周均价为18.98美元/磅，较上周下跌0.6%，较历史高点下跌4%，但较去年同期上涨30%，较2023年同期上涨19%。里脊价格通常受年末节假日需求推动，在10月至11月底/12月初期间呈现上涨趋势。

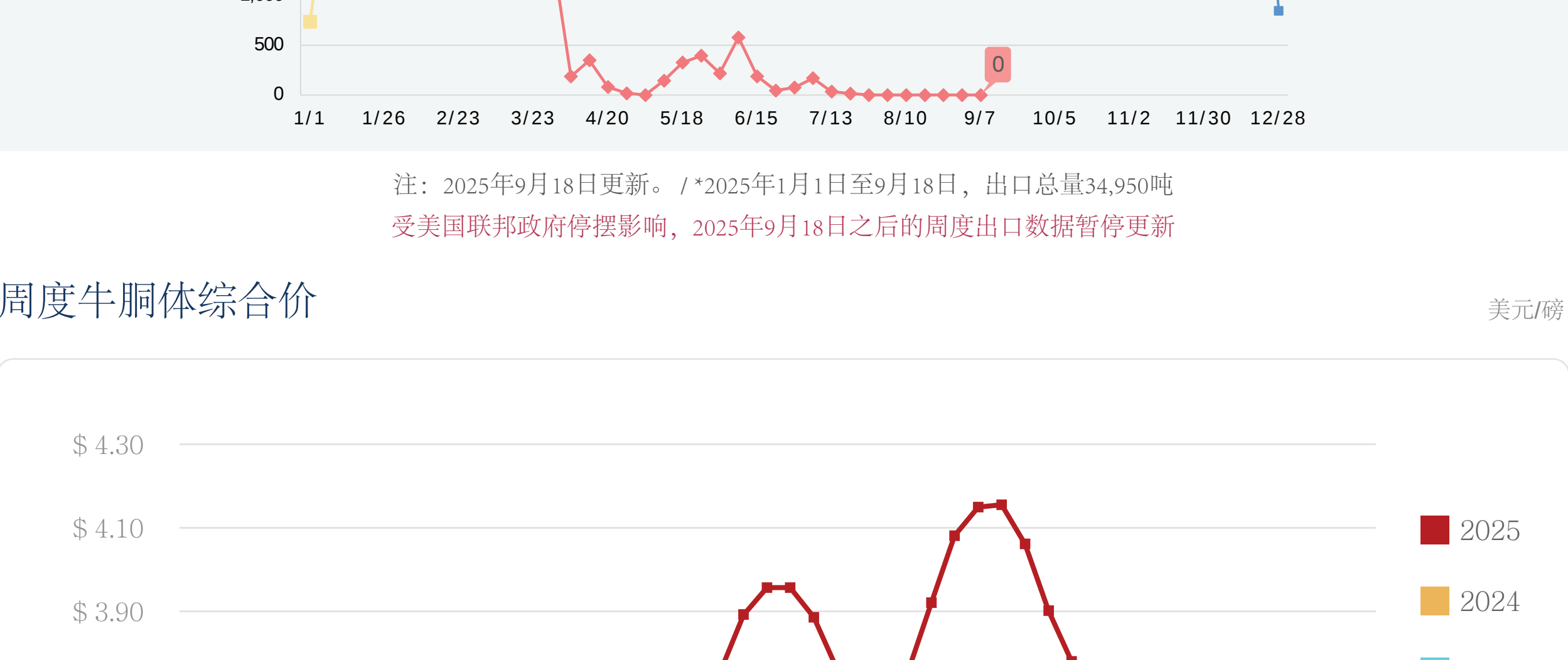
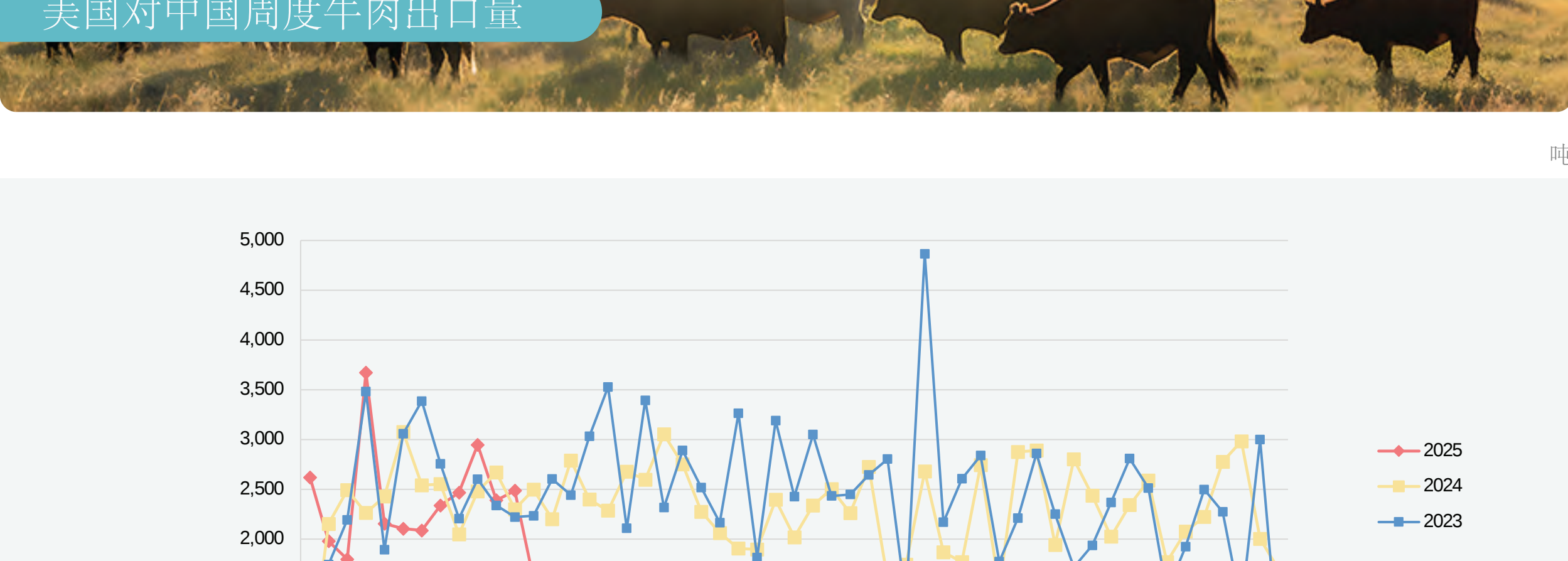
50%牛碎肉价格自5月中旬至7月中旬持续上涨，并于7月中旬因育肥牛生产量骤减及季节性碎牛肉需求支撑，创下2.62美元/磅的历史纪录，此后价格有所回调。本周价格较上周微涨0.6%至1.40美元/磅，较去年同期大幅上涨127%，较2023年同期上涨67%。

90%牛碎肉价格于六周前创下4.35美元/磅的历史新高，此后小幅走低。本周价格环比下跌3.9%至4.10美元/磅，为7月初以来最低水平。由于母牛屠宰量减少导致国内瘦牛肉供应持续紧张，而需求保持强劲，本周价格仍较去年同期上涨16%，较2023年同期上涨40%。除加拿大和墨西哥外，所有进口碎肉均需缴纳至少10%的额外对等关税。本周进口90%牛碎肉价格创下3.89美元/磅的历史新高，较去年同期上涨31%，较2023年同期上涨55%。

本周活牛屠宰量预估为56.7万头，环比上升3.7%，同比下降6.6%。2025年至今累计屠宰量同比下降6.3%。

现货阔公牛价格较上周五上涨9.02美元/百磅，至239.73美元/百磅。活牛期货合约本周前期交易走高，并于周四创下合约新高，但周五有消息称特朗普政府已达成协议将从阿根廷进口更多牛肉（细节暂不明确），导致合约大幅走低：10月合约报240.25美元/百磅（较上周五上涨1.77美元），12月合约报241.83美元/百磅（下跌0.70美元），2月合约报242.83美元/百磅（下跌2.57美元）。

美国猪肉市场动向

猪肉胴体综合价自5月中旬至6月末持续走高，6月底涨至1.21美元/磅，创2022年以来最高水平。此价格随季节性回落，本周再次环比下跌1.9%，至1.03美元/磅，为5月以来最低，但较去年同期上涨8%，较2023年同期上涨16%。

初级分割品价格环比变动方面，猪腰脊（loin）微涨0.7%，而其他部位价格均下跌：后腿（ham）下跌2%、肋排（rib）下跌2%、前腿（picnic）下跌2%、五花（belly）下跌3%、肩胛（butt）下跌4%。

重磅带骨后腿价格于6月中旬冲高至1.21美元/磅后，7月中旬至8月初再次上涨，触及1.21美元/磅（2014年以来最高点）。上周均价1.05美元/磅，为四周来最高；本周价格环比下跌2.7%至1.02美元/磅，较去年同期上涨24%，较2023年同期上涨27%。尽管带骨后腿价格通常在10月的前几周呈下行趋势，但过去几周价格一直维持在1.02至1.05美元/磅的狭窄区间内，且自5月以来价格始终高于去年同期水平。

现货箱装去骨后腿肉因交易清淡导致价格波动剧烈。本周成交量3.6万磅，略高于上周的3.5万磅，但低于两周前的7.6万磅（八周成交量近期高点为10.9万磅）。本周成交价格区间为1.72-2.32美元/磅，均价1.78美元/磅，环比上涨4%。自5月以来，箱装去骨后腿肉的价格始终高于去年同期水平，本周价格较去年同期上涨22%，较2023年同期上涨26%。

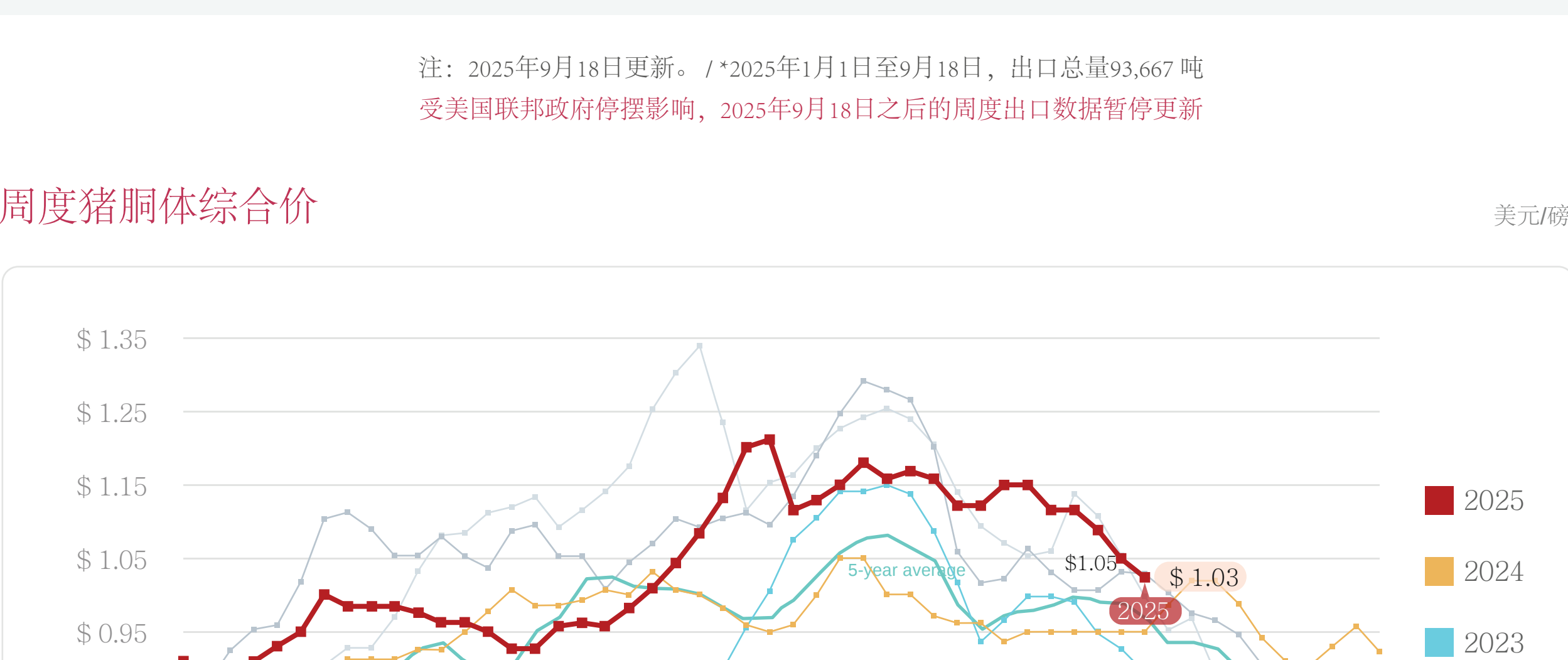
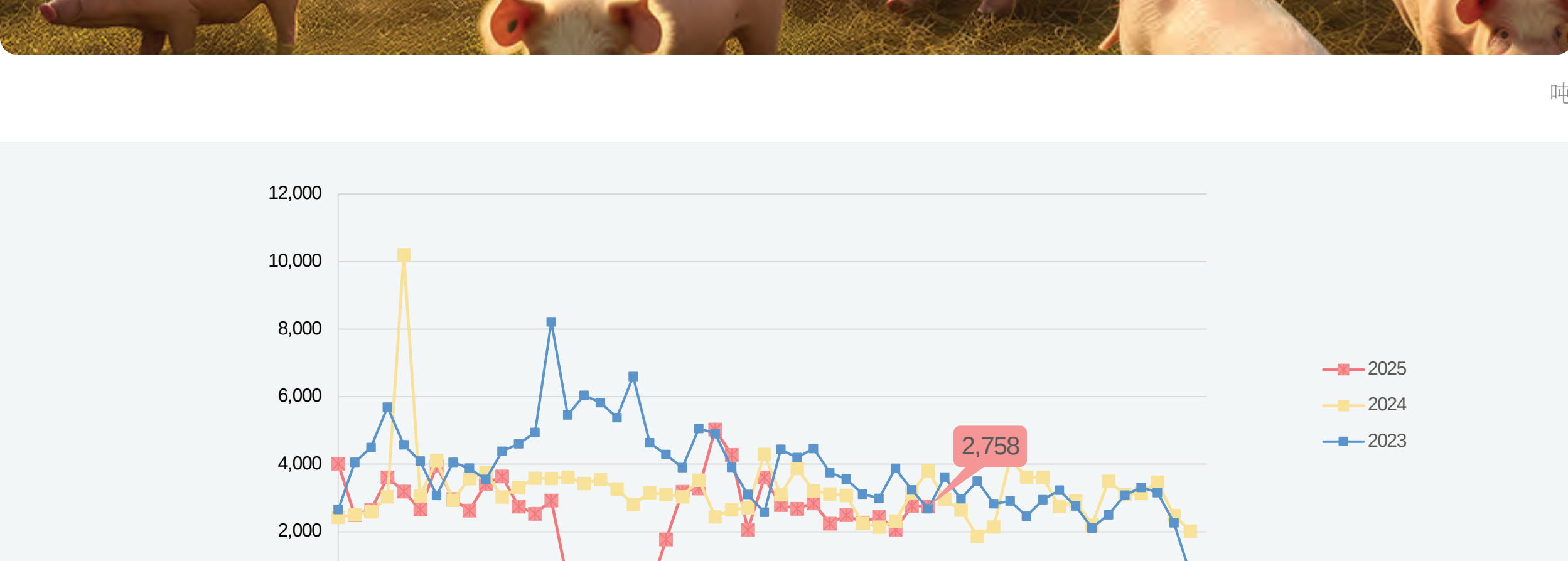
五花批发价格在8月达到年度高点后呈下降趋势，9-13磅箱装去皮五花肉价格在8月达到年度高点3.37美元/磅，高于2024年的峰值2.79美元/磅，但低于2023年的峰值3.50美元/磅。随后在9月至10月期间价格走低。上周五花肉价格大幅下跌，但本周小幅回调至2.66美元/磅，为6月初以来最低水平。今年大部分时间内价格均同比上涨，本周价格较去年同期上涨3%，较2023年同期上涨7%。

13-17磅去皮五花肉价格于今年8月达到年度高点2.35美元/磅，高于去年的峰值1.83美元/磅，但低于2023年的峰值2.74美元/磅。此后价格走低，但本周小幅回调至2.66美元/磅，为6月初以来最低水平。今年大部分时间内价格均同比上涨，而本周是自1月以来首次跌破去年同期水平。

本周生猪肉屠宰量预估为258.8万头，环比上升0.4%，同比下降0.7%。

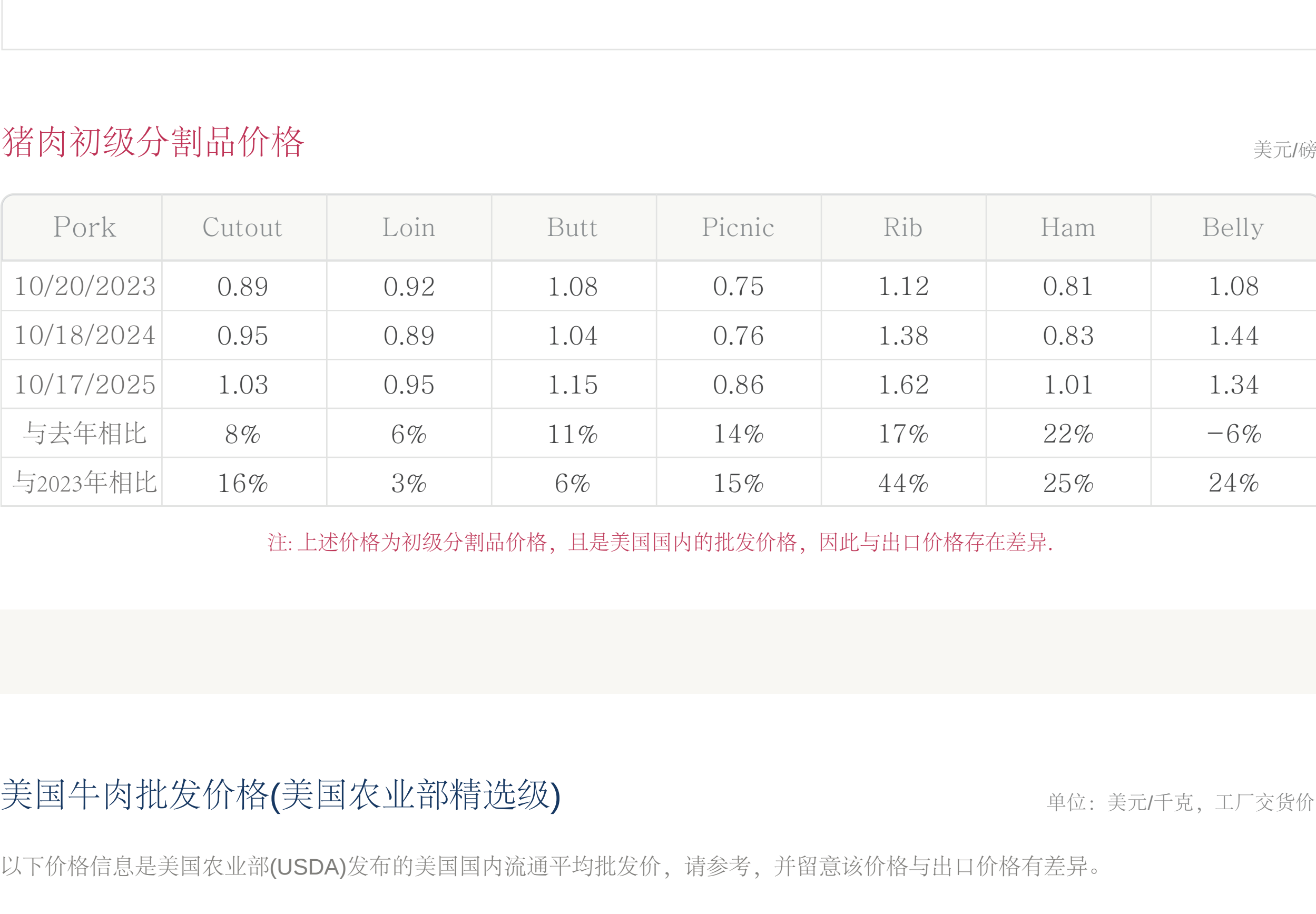
继两周前下跌2.32美元后，现货生猪价格上周进一步下跌6.26美元/百磅，至90.14美元/百磅。瘦肉猪肉期货合约在9月《生猪存栏报告》发布后于9月底创下合约新低，但过去三周交易大多走低，本周下半周合约价格更是创下8月中旬以来最低水平：12月合约82.38美元/百磅（较上周五下跌1.65美元），2月合约84.78美元/百磅（下跌1.52美元），4月合约88.65美元/百磅（下跌1.38美元），5月合约91.53美元/百磅。

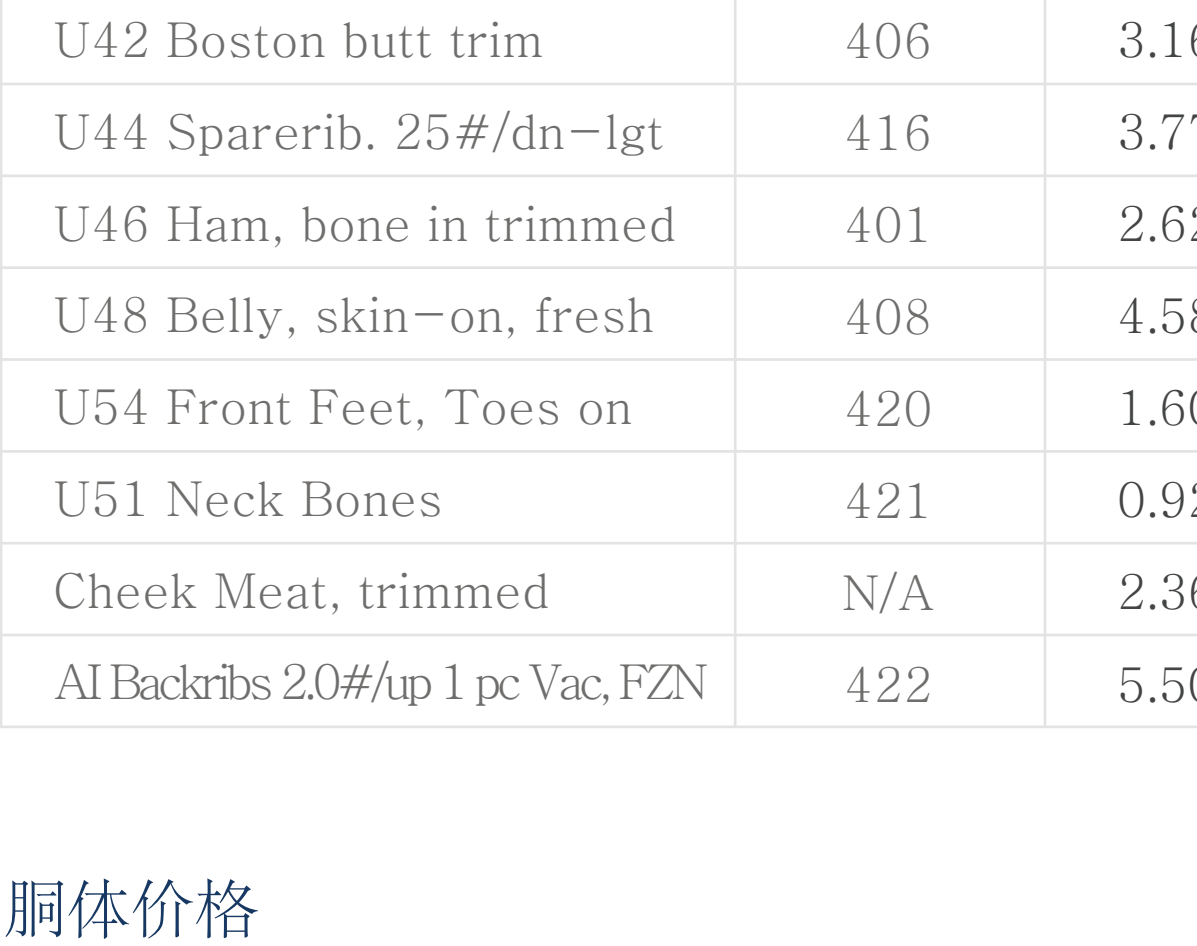

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U.S. beef market trends

U.S. Beef Market Trends

The Choice beef cutout reached a record high of \$4.14/lb. the first week of September. Prices then adjusted lower over the past five weeks from mid-September through last week, but this week, the cutout stabilized and held at \$3.66/lb., up 0.1% from last week. The Choice cutout was up 15% from last year and up 20% from 2023.

The Choice/Select spread narrowed from \$18.69/cwt last week to \$15.81/cwt this week. The Choice/Select spread was down from \$25.58/cwt last year and from \$26.56/cwt in 2023.

Compared to last week, values increased for the Choice short plate (+2%), rib (+1%), loin (+1%), and brisket (+1%) primals. Values were steady for both the Choice round and flank primals, while the Choice chuck primal value decreased by 1%.

Prices for Choice boneless heavy ribeyes and NY strip loins turned higher again this week ahead of the year-end holidays. Prices for Choice boneless heavy ribeyes reached \$14.72/lb. in early September, which was the highest since the record price of \$15.14/lb. last December. Prices then trended modestly lower through September and into October and averaged \$13.78/lb. last week. Prices typically trend higher through November and reach their annual peak in early December. This week, prices increased by 2% from last week to \$14.01/lb., which was up 18% from last year and up 24% from 2023.

Prices for Choice NY strip loins typically peak for the year in June and July before moving seasonally lower into October. But this year, prices only adjusted lower through late July and have since held mostly steady to slightly higher. This week, prices increased by 3% from last week to an average of \$8.84/lb., which was the highest since late July. Prices typically trend higher through October. Prices were up 19% from last year and up 35% from 2023.

Prices for Choice boneless top butts also peak for the year in June and July before trending seasonally lower into October. Prices have held relatively steady for the last two weeks, and this week, prices edged down just 0.2% from last week to \$5.01/lb., which was up 17% from last year and up 31% from 2023.

Prices for Choice beef tenderloins surged in August and reached a record high of \$19.73/lb. this September. Prices have since adjusted only modestly lower, and this week, prices averaged \$18.98/lb., down 0.6% from last week and down 4% from that record high. Prices were up 30% from last year and up 19% from 2023. Prices typically trend higher from October through late November/early December on demand ahead of the year-end holidays.

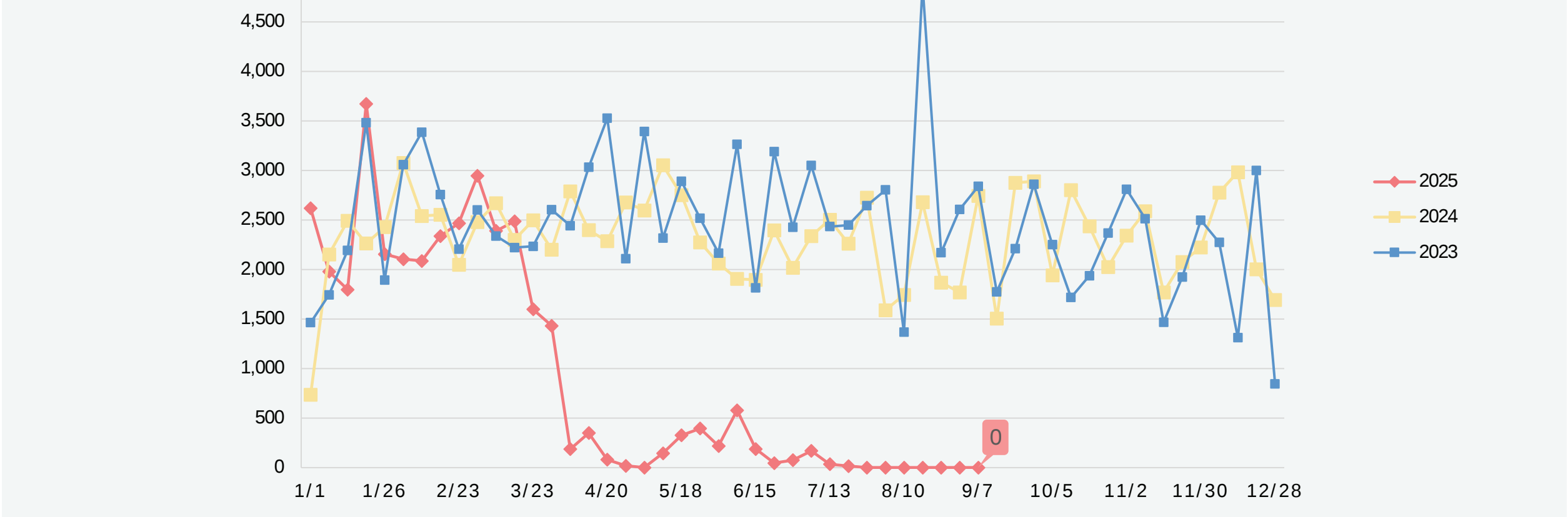
50% beef trim prices increased from mid-May through mid-July and reached a record high of \$3.62/lb. in mid-July as fed beef production dropped off sharply and as seasonal demand for ground beef also supported prices. Prices have since adjusted lower. This week, prices edged up 0.6% from last week to an average of \$1.40/lb., which was up 127% from last year and up 67% from 2023.

90% beef trim prices reached a record high of \$4.35/lb. six weeks ago. Prices have been trending slightly lower since then, but this week, prices dropped 3.9% from last week to an average of \$4.10/lb., which was the lowest since early July. Prices were still up 16% from last year and up 40% from 2023 this week as demand remains strong and supplies are tighter for domestic lean beef due to smaller cow slaughter. Trim imports are now subject to at least 10% added reciprocal duties for all suppliers except Canada and Mexico. Imported 90% beef trim prices reached a record \$3.89/lb. this week, which was up 31% from last year and up 55% from 2023.

Weekly estimated slaughter was 567,000 head, up 3.7% from last week but down 6.6% from last year. 2025 year-to-date cattle slaughter was down 6.3% year-over-year.

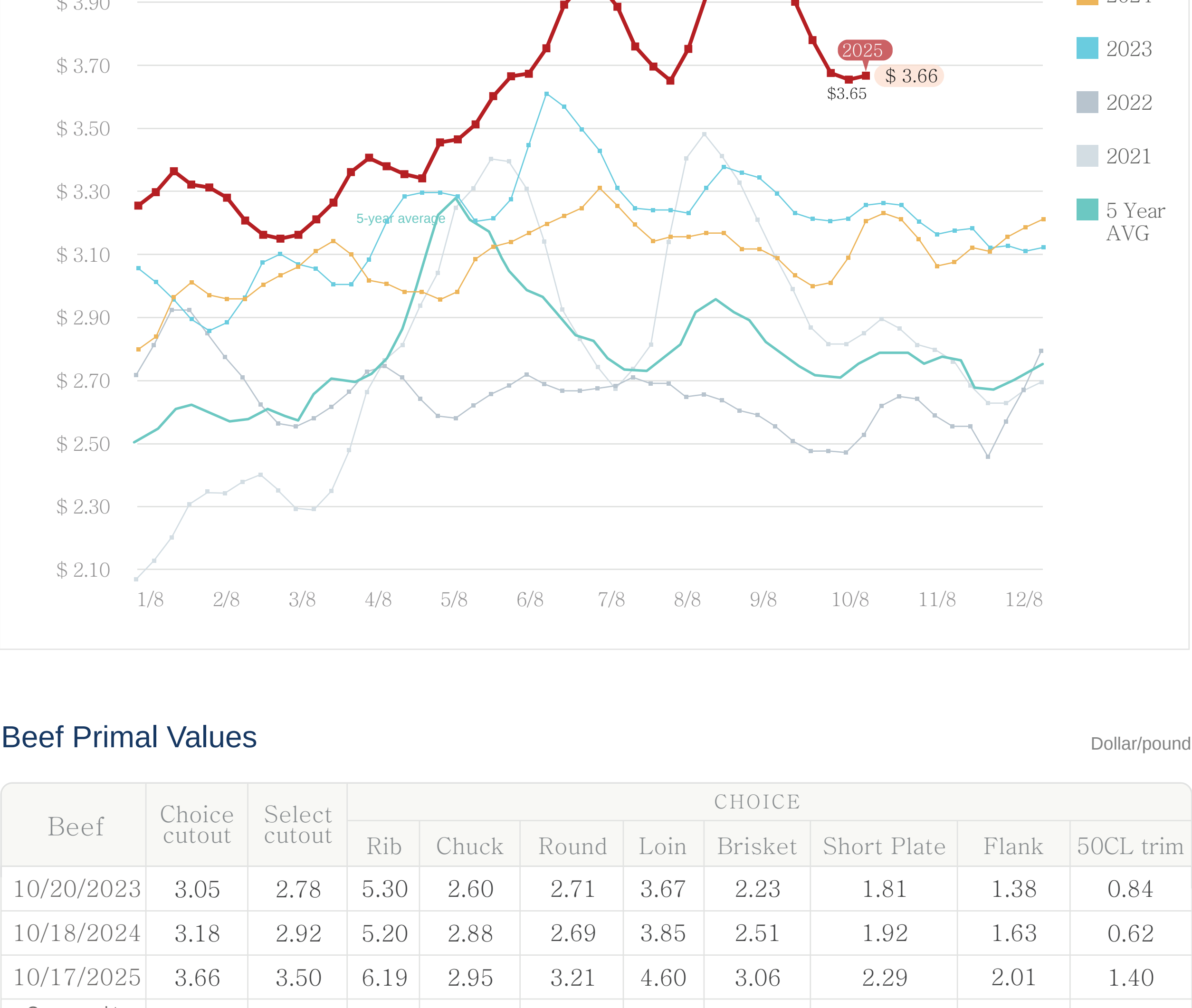
Cash steer prices increased by \$9.02/cwt from last Friday to an average of \$239.73/cwt. Live cattle futures contracts traded higher early in the week and reached new contract highs on Thursday, but contracts traded sharply lower on Friday after the vague news that the Trump administration had reached a deal to import more beef from Argentina. October: \$240.25/cwt (+\$1.77 from last Friday), December: \$241.83 (-\$0.70), and February: \$242.83 (-\$2.57).

U.S. pork market trends

U.S. Pork Market Trend

The pork cutout trended higher from mid-May through late June and reached \$1.21/lb. at the end of June, which was the highest level since August 2022. The cutout has since moved seasonally lower, and this week, the cutout decreased by 1.9% from last week to an average of \$1.03/lb., which was the lowest since May. The cutout was up 8% from last year and up 16% from 2023.

Compared to last week, the loin primal value edged up 0.7%, while values moved lower for the other pork primals: ham (-2%), rib (-2%), picnic (-2%), belly (-3%), and butt (-4%).

After spiking to \$1.21/lb. in mid-June, heavy bone-in ham prices increased again from mid-July through early August. When they again reached \$1.21/lb., the highest level since 2014. Last week, prices averaged \$1.05/lb., which was the highest in four weeks. This week, prices trended down 2.7% from last week to \$1.02/lb., which was up 24% from last year and up 27% from 2023. Prices typically trend lower through the first few weeks of October, but prices have been holding in a tight range between \$1.02 and \$1.05/lb. for the last five weeks, and prices have been above year-ago levels since May.

Spot boneless, boxed rollout ham prices have been volatile on thin trading volumes. This week the trading volume was 36,000 lbs., compared to 35,000 lbs. last week and down from 76,000 lbs. at the recent high trading volume was 109,000 lbs. eight weeks ago). Prices traded in a range between \$1.72 and \$2.32/lb. this week for an average of \$1.78/lb., which was up 4% from last week. Prices have been above year-ago levels since May, and this week, prices were up 22% from last year and up 26% from 2023.

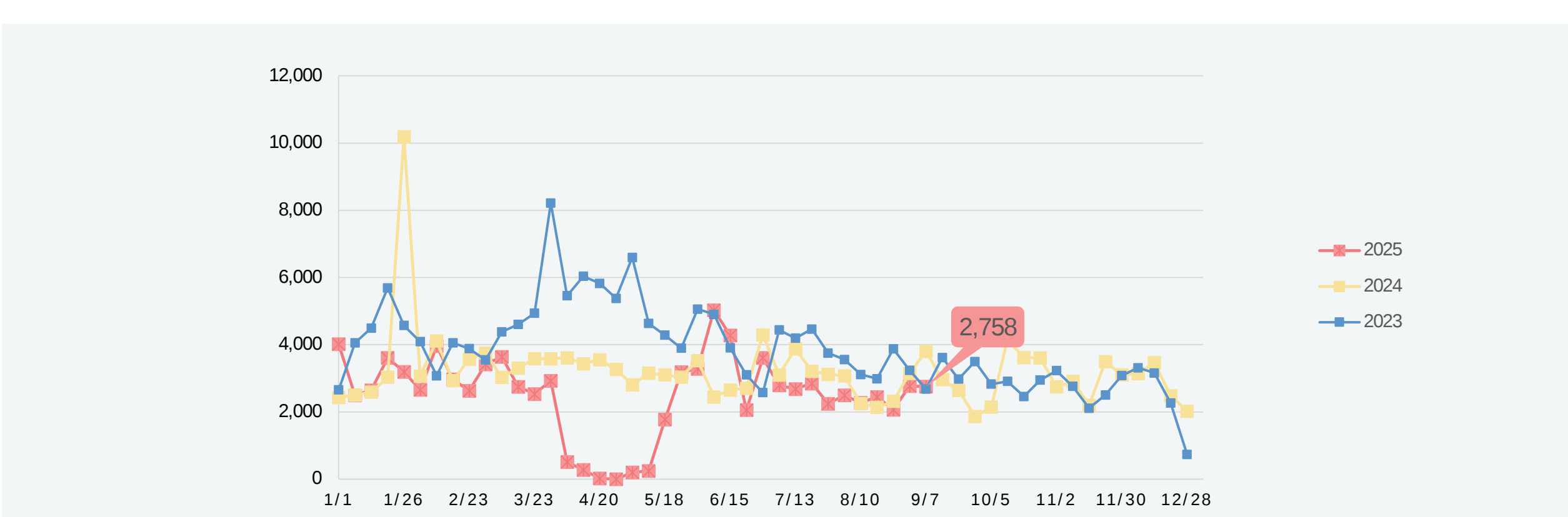
Wholesale belly prices are trending lower after reaching their high point for the year in August. Prices for 9-13 lb. boxed derind bellies reached a high for the year at \$3.37/lb. in August, up from the peak of \$2.79/lb. in 2024 but down from the peak of \$3.50/lb. in 2023. Prices then trended lower in September and into October. Prices dropped sharply last week but corrected somewhat this week to \$2.66/lb., the lowest since the beginning of June. Prices have been above year-ago levels most of the year and this week were up 3% from last year and up 7% from 2023.

Prices for 13 – 17 lb. derind bellies reached an annual high of \$2.35/lb. this August, up from the peak of \$1.83/lb. last year but down from the peak of \$2.74/lb. in 2023. Prices have since trended lower and this week averaged \$1.61/lb., the lowest since April. Prices were down 6% from last year but up 25% from 2023. Prices have been above year-ago levels for most of this year, and this was the first week they dropped below year-ago since January.

Weekly hog slaughter was estimated at 2,588 million head, up 0.4% from last week but down 0.7% from last year.

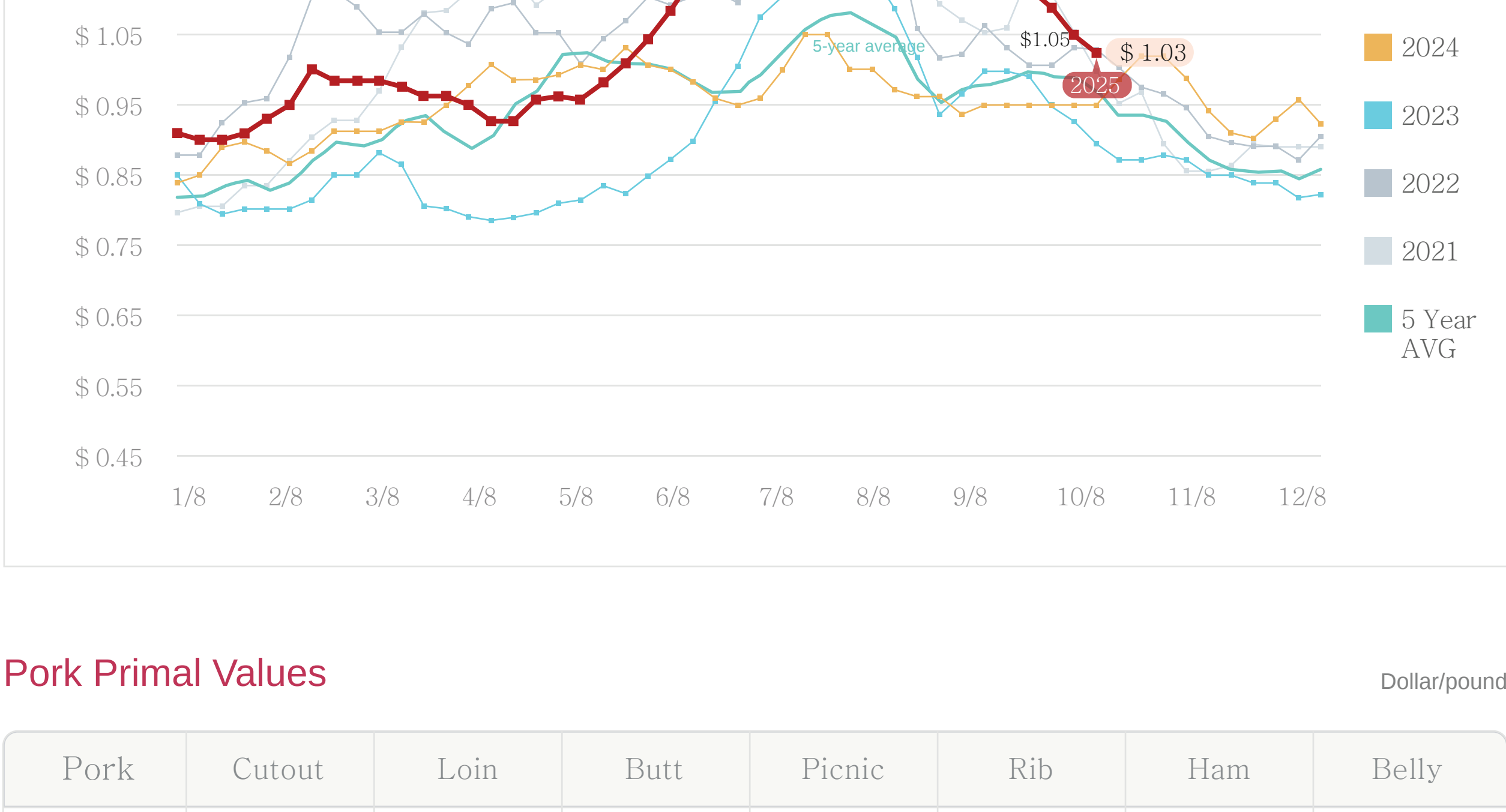
Cash hog price, after dropping \$2.32 two weeks ago, fell further by \$6.26 last week to \$90.14/cwt. Lean hog futures contracts traded at contract highs in late September after the release of the September Hogs and Pigs Report, but futures contracts have been trading mostly lower over the last three weeks with contracts trading at the lowest level since mid-August during the second half of this week: December: \$82.38 (-\$1.65 from last Friday), February: \$84.78 (-\$1.52), April: \$88.65 (-\$1.38), and May: \$91.53.

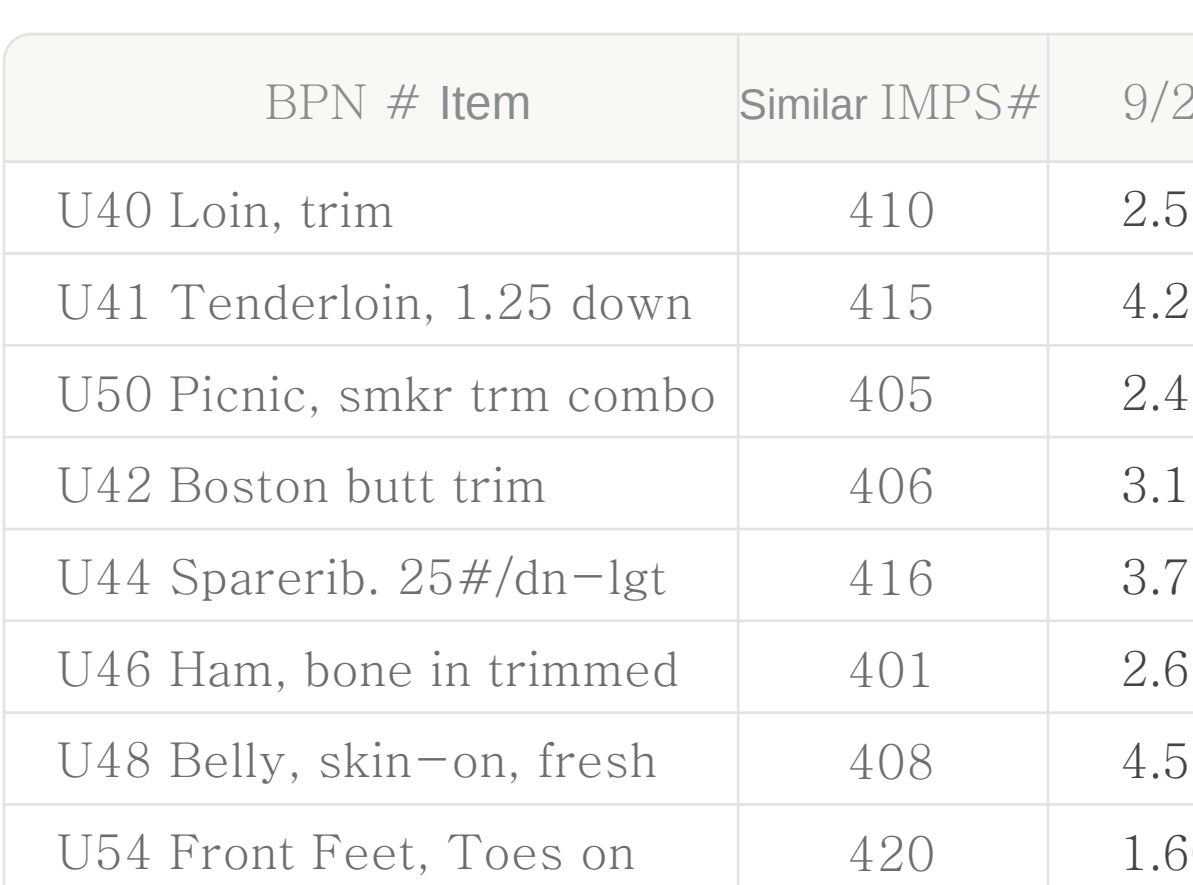

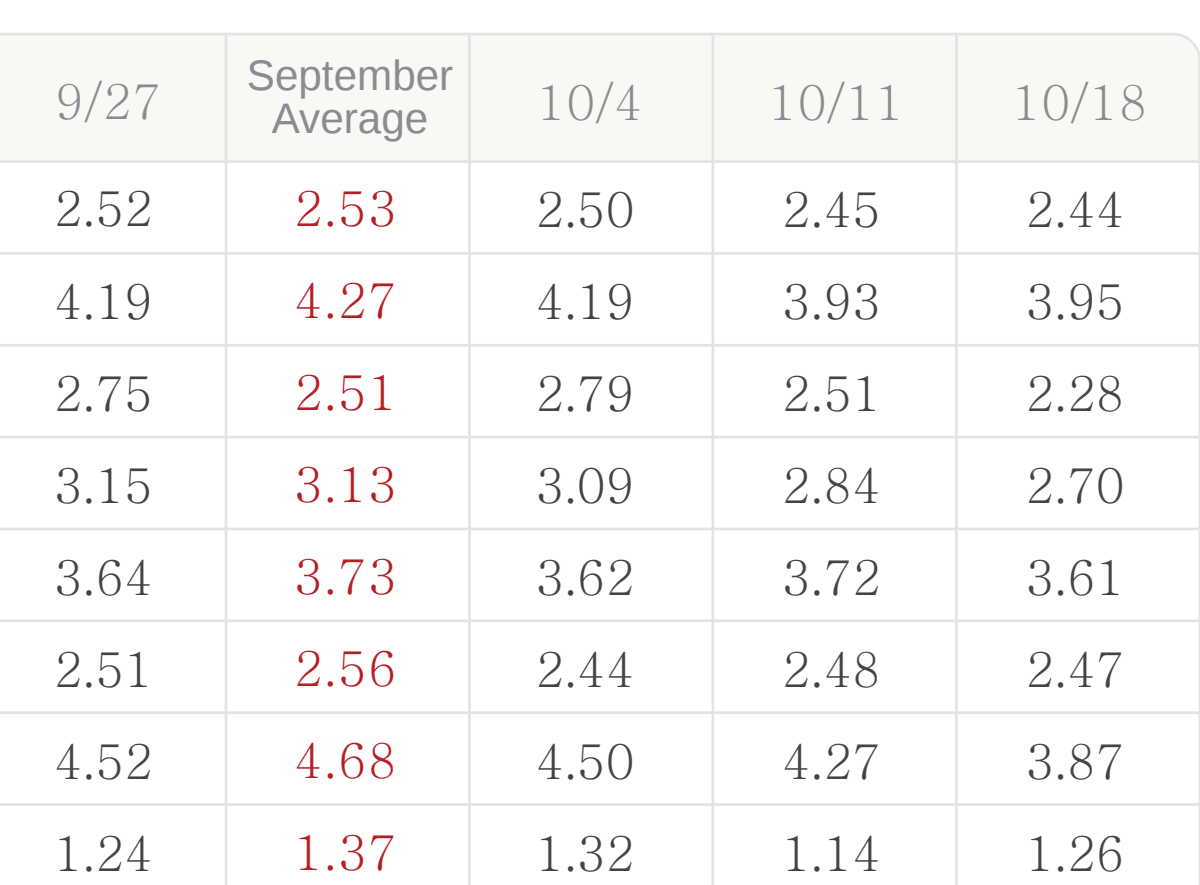
